

Honolulu, Hawaii : October 25, 2005 : Former Motorola (China) President of Technologies joins DragonBridge Capital

John C. Chiang, Ph. D.

Dr. John C. Chiang, joined DragonBridge as part of it ' s China team on October 1, 2005. Dr. Chiang retired from Motorola China in July of 2005 where he was President of Motorola (China) Technologies Limited, responsible for managing Motorola research and development entities in China.

Dr. Chiang joined Motorola China in March 2000, as Assistant General Manager of Network System Sector. In August, he assumed the role of Director - China Strategy, and in October, added the role of Director - Advanced Asia-Pacific Applied Research Center, which received CMM Level 5 certification, the highest software maturity capacity certification. In 2002, he assumed the role of Senior Director of Strategy and Business Development, introduced new Motorola business units into China, including Motorola Ventures. In 2003, he took the additional responsibility of Director of Motorola China R&D Institute, the largest multinational R&D presence in China.

Born in Beijing, Dr. Chiang grew up in Taiwan and studied at Johns Hopkins University in the US. After receiving his Ph. D. in 1975, he taught 4 years in universities. He joined AT&T Bell Labs in 1980. In 1984, Dr. Chiang joined Racal-Milgo where he developed a network management system for large scale data communications networks and later was in charge of fast packet technology exploration.

Dr. Chiang received EMBA from Georgia State University in 1989, and taught International Business in 1990-1991 at Georgia State University. Since 1992, he had served several advisory roles to governmental entities in both Taiwan and Mainland China.
